Stardate: April 4, 2010

Focus Scripture – John 20:1-18

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went toward the tomb. The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. Then the disciples returned to their homes. But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Parent. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Parent and your Parent, to my God and your God.' " Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

Bread for the World Offering of Letters – This year's Bread for the World Offering of Letters will be received on Sunday, April 25. Letters will be available to be signed during the morning hours. Instead of hunger issues the focus is on the Tax Credits which are expiring this year, in particular the Earned Income Tax Credit, the Child Tax Credit and the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance. These programs are a boon to low income families providing money to help pay for rent and utilities and other necessities which food assistance (WIC and food stamps) cannot do. For those of you who prefer to handwrite your letters (and studies have shown that these letters get the most attention from lawmakers), sample letters are on the table in the hall. Bring them on April 25 and they will be included with the others to be faxed to our congressmen.
