Five families are scheduled to arrive at the end of June from TOX Ministries, a UCC new church start in Phoenix ("nestled" at Church of the Beattitudes UCC). Others are arriving daily. 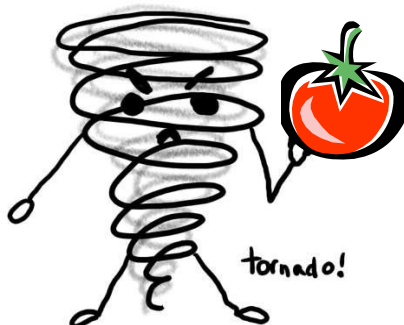
VOLUNTEERS TO HELP WITH SUMMER SUNDAY SCHOOL
